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
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

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Appointed Times / Biblical Holidays / Moadim

Spring*:

Pesakh - Passover Yom HaBikkurim - Firstfruits - Resurrection Day Counting the Omer (*For a thorough look at the Spring Moadim, see Day Fifty: Fulfilling the Omer, p. 439.)

Summer:

Shavuot - Feast of Weeks - Pentecost

Fall:

Yom Teruah -Day of Sounding the Shofar - Rosh HaShannah Yom Kippur - Day of Atonement Sukkot - Feast of Tabernacles

Hebrew Terms:

- ນາພ້**' Yeshua** *Yeh-shoo-ah* Jesus' original Hebrew Name, which basically means Salvation and is pronounced and spelled almost exactly the same as the Hebrew word for salvation.
- Tשוע".Yeshuah Yeh-shoo-ah salvation
- מועד Moad *moh-odd* Hebrew for Appointed Time, referring to a Biblical Holiday
- מוערים Moadim moh-ah-deem- plural of Moad
- עמר **Omer** oh-mehr a unit of measure for grain that has come to refer to the counting of the days as commanded between Firstfruits (Resurrection) and Shavuot (Pentecost).
- יום הבכורים Yom HaBikkurim Yohm Ha-Beek-kur-eem Day of Firstfruits. Yeshua arose on the barley Firstfruits Moad.
- שְׁבֵעֹת Shavuot *shah-voo-oht* the Biblical Holiday also called Feast of Weeks and Pentecost. Also the wheat Firstfruits Moad, usually in May.
- מצה Matzah a special unleavened bread for Passover
- **Phylacteries** also called tefillin are small leather boxes containing certain Scripture that Jewish men strap with leather straps to their left arm and forehead daily for morning liturgy prayer time.
- שבת Shabbat *shah-baht* the Sabbath day of rest, the seventh day of the week which begins Friday evening and ends Saturday evening..
- שבתות Shabbatot shah-bah-toht plural of Shabbat, Sabbaths
- ברית חדשה Brit Khadashah (also spelled B'rit Hadashah or Hadasha or Chadasha) *B'reet Khah-d'-shah* (The **kh** is a gutteral sound.) New Covenant (sometimes referring to the Covenant itself; sometimes to the whole New Testament.)
- רוח Ruakh (also spelled Ruach) *roo-ahkh* (gutteral sound) Spirit
- רוח הקרש Ruakh HaKodesh the Holy Spirit
- ロロン Mashiakh (also spelled Meshiach) Muh-shee-akh Messiah
- המשה המשה haMashiakh ha-Muh-shee-akh the Messiah

<u>Untroduction</u> Why COUNT THE OMER?

The Appointed Time / Moad Explained

Counting the Omer begins on Resurrection Day, the glorious day our Savior Yeshua arose from the grave, which is also Firstfruits, the Biblical Appointed Time when the Firstfruit offering of barley was to be brought to the Temple.¹ **Counting the Omer** is the day God commanded us to begin counting the days leading up to the next Appointed Time (Moad), Feast of Weeks (Shavuot):

Leviticus 23:15-16 Then you are to count from the morrow after the Shabbat, from the day that you brought the omer of the wave offering, seven complete Shabbatot. 16 Until the morrow after the seventh Shabbat you are to count fifty days, and then present a new grain offering to Adonai.

So Resurrection Day not only occurs in the midst of the **seven day** Moad of Matzah (Feast of Unleavened Bread), but also begins the period of **seven weeks** of counting each day. The Jewish leaders have taken this literally, just like they have other commandments, for instance the one to "bind" the commandments "on your hand, and they shall be as frontlets between your eyes," and thus the practice of binding phylacteries (which contain Scripture) every day. The tradition for **Counting the Omer** is to count each day with a special blessing.

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So if you are reading this on Resurrection Day or during any of the fifty days of Counting the Omer, and you haven't counted the day yet, how about you stop right now and do the counting in obedience to this command of Adonai.

So take a minute to look at the list below to figure out what the traditional words are for the day you are in. The first part is for every day, given in Hebrew then English. The last sentence needs to be specific for each day. After you have it figured out, then stand up and say the blessing.

The Blessing for Counting the Omer

This first part is spoken every day:

Hebrew:

בְּרוּך אַתָּה יְיָ אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶך הַעוֹלַם אַשֵׁר קִהְשָׁנוּ בִּמִצוֹתֵיו וִצְוַנוּ עַל סִפִּירַת הַעָוֹמֵר:

Barukh Ata ADONAI Elohenu, melekh ha-olam, asher qee'd'shanu b'mitz-votav, v'tzee-vanu al sefirat (pronounced **seh**-fee-raht) ha-Omer.

English:

Blessed are You, Adonai (LORD) our Elohim (God), King of the Universe who has sanctified us with Your commandments and commanded us concerning the counting of the Omer.

Specific for each day

Figure out what day you are in, then find out what to say:

Day 1 היום יום אָחָד לְעָוֹמֶר Ha-yom yom echad (eh-**khahd**) la' Omer Today is day one of the Omer.

Day 2 היום שׁנֵי יְמִים לְשָׂוֹמֶר Ha-yom shnei (shnay) yamim (yah-meem) la' Omer Today is day two of the Omer.

Days 3-6 יְמִים לְעָוֹמֶר Ha-yom _____yamim la' Omer Today is day <u>(3-6)</u> of the Omer 3-shlo-shah, 4-arba-ah. 5-ha-mee-shah, 6-shee-shah

Day ד הַיּוֹם שָׁבְעָה יְמִים שָׁהֵם שָׁבְוּיַ אָחָד לְעָוֹמֵר Tha-yom sheev'ah yamim, shehem shavuah echad la' Omer. Today is day seven, which is one week of the Omer. Days 8-13 הַיוֹם יַמָרוֹם) שֶׁהֵם שְׁבְוּיַ אֶחָד לְשְוֹמֶר Ha-yom yamim (for eleven on: yom) shehem shavuah

echad v'____yamim (for eleven on: yom) shehem shavuah echad v'___yamim la'Omer.

Today is day (<u>8-13</u>), which is one week and (<u>2-6</u>) days of the Omer. 8-shmonah, 9-teesa, 10-a'sa'ra, 11-achad-asar, 12 shteim-asar, 13-shalosh-asar.

The Reason

So why would God want people to be counting the days leading up to Shavuot? If someone says about an event, "I'm counting the days," it usually means they are looking forward to something really awesome. They might be counting the days until they change jobs or until retirement, or until graduation, or better yet, they might be counting the days until their wedding or till a new baby's due date! So let's see if there is something amazing for which we are supposed to be counting the days in excitement and anticipation.

Exodus 19:1 (NKJV) in the third month after the children of Israel had gone out of the land of Egypt. On the same day they came to the wilderness of Sinai.

Since before the time of Yeshua, Jewish scholars have interpreted that phrase "on the same day" to mean that the children of Israel arrived at the wilderness of Sinai on the first day of the third month of the year, the month of Sivan. Then if you continue to read in Exodus 19, you realize that a couple of days went by. They camped a night or two. Moses went up the mountain, then told the people what God said. They promise to do everything God said. Then Moses went back up to the Lord to report the people's answer. Then the Lord told Moses to tell the people to prepare for three days to meet

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Him, so He came down on Mount Sinai around the sixth day of the month of Sivan. Depending on what day of the week Passover falls, it would be on the 5th, 6th or 7th day of Sivan when Shavuot occurs.

So what happened on Mount Sinai? God came down in fire and smoke and lightning and thunder with the mountain shaking and the blast of the Heavenly Shofar!!! WHOA! Think about it! It's really big! Right?!! I mean, God spoke the Ten Commandments from the mountain directly to the people! But an even bigger way of thinking about this is that's when He started to give us the Bible! It was the beginning of God giving us His Word! So that's a pretty amazing thing.

So now let's look at the New Covenant, and we will find another overwhelmingly awesome event that occurred on Shavuot. Pentecost! How do we know Pentecost happened on Shavuot? Because the Greek word, Pentecost means 50 as in counting the 50 days. It is the Greek term for the Moad, Shavuot. *Shavuot* means *weeks* (the Feast of Weeks), and is the plural form of the word *seven*. So it also means *sevens*, implying seven sevens. So both words are based on numbers for counting, as in the Counting of the Omer.

So two of the most important events in the history of mankind occurred on Shavuot! The giving of God's Word on Mt. Sinai and the outpouring of the Ruakh HaKodesh, the Holy Spirit, following Yeshua's sacrifice on the Cross, and His Resurrection. On Shavuot, 50 days after the Resurrection, the Ruakh came to dwell in and overflow every believer.

So I definitely would say, and I'm sure you would too, that the beginning of the giving of the Word of God and the beginning of the outpouring of the Ruakh are both remembrances very much worth counting the days until we celebrate their occurrences. Right? So on Resurrection Day - Yom HaBikkurim - the Day of Firstfruits, we begin excitedly counting the days and looking forward to celebrating the Word and the Ruakh.

I mean the Resurrection is already exciting and amazing enough to be exuberantly joyful about, but Adonai wants us to get even more excited about being filled with His Spirit because His death and Resurrection enabled that to happen. Without the Cross and the empty tomb, there would be no Pentecost! It is only by being cleansed in His atoning Blood that we can be made pure so that His presence can dwell within us. And it is by His Ruakh in us that we can begin to understand His Word!

The traditional church has two countdown periods, Advent for anticipating Yeshua's birth and Lent for preparing our hearts for commemorating the Crucifixion and Resurrection. But God only commanded one counting, and it isn't either one of those. Those two countings are nice. Those two seasons are of highest importance (even though their dates and names might be off), but God wants us to mark two other vitally important events for believers with a counting, Pentecost and Mt. Sinai!

So on Resurrection Day, let's begin the counting and ask Him what we should be studying and meditating on as we anticipate the two glorious events. We will help you do that in this book, and in my *Shavuot* book.

Timing Disagreement with Traditional Judaism

So in our congregation, we Messianic Jewish believers observe Yom HaBikkurim as commanded and per tradition, giving a Firstfruits offering in faith, trusting God to bless our finances the rest of the year. But we also celebrate it as Resurrection Day and rejoice in the Resurrection of our Savior and Messiah, Yeshua.

Then we begin the Counting of the Omer on that day as commanded in the Torah, which should be in line with the non-Messianic Jewish counting. However, if you look on a traditional Jewish calendar, their count always starts on the second day of Unleavened Bread (Matzah), on whatever day of the week that falls. On the years that the second day of Matzah lands on a Sunday, our count starts the same day as traditional Jewish calendars. Thus on those years, we celebrate Shavuot at the same time as the rest of the Jewish community. The difference is based on differing interpretations of this phrase in Leviticus.

Leviticus 23:15 (CJB) "From the day after the day of rest...

The "*day of rest*" can be the Saturday Shabbat during the week of Matzah, but it could also be the first day of Matzah (which is also the day of Passover) because God commanded that it must be a Shabbat. The non-Messianic Jewish community has decided that this phrase is referring to the first day of Matzah. We Messianic Jews have chosen the Saturday Shabbat during the week of Matzah.

So one year, when I was reading the traditional Jewish readings that have been laid out, a specific reading for every day of Unleavened Bread in Hebrew, and happened to be reading Leviticus 23 thinking it was chapter 22. So I wasn't reading like "Oh yea, I know this." Instead I was really focusing on it as I read it.

I was using my interlinear Bible that has the English right below the Hebrew. So what I do is I cover up the English and try to understand the Hebrew. If I don't understand a certain word, I look down and see what the English word is. But the Hebrew in that passage has very familiar words, so it was really easy for me to read it all in Hebrew without looking at the English. And I was stunned!!! I was just amazed! I wasn't thinking about the calendar or anything at that moment. But when I read it in the Hebrew, it was so clear! It was completely clear that Firstfruits and the start of the Count of the Omer should be on a Sunday, the way we Messianics do it!

So here is Leviticus 23:15-16 in Hebrew.

ּוּסְפַרְשֶּׁם לָכֶם, מִמְחֲרַת הַשַּׁבָּת, מִיּוֹם הַבִיאֲכֶם, אֶת-עֹמֶר הַתְּנוּפָה: שֶׁבַע שַׁבָּתוֹת, תְּמִימֹת תִּהְיֶינָה עַד מִמְּחֲרַת הַשַׁבָּת הַשְׁבִיעַת, תִּסְפְרוּ חַמִשִׁים יוֹם; וְהִקְרַבְשָּם מנִחַה חֵדַשָׁה, לַיהוַה

It says in Hebrew, "you are to count mi-makharet ha-Shabbat (from the day after the Shabbat)," then it goes on, "the day that you bring the sheaf to wave." Then it says, "sheva shabbatot (seven Shabbats) shall be completed for you." So in this verse 15 alone, it is very clear that you are supposed to start the count on the day after Shabbat. Verse 16 is where it really gets interesting. *"ohd mih-mah-khar-raht* (until the day after) *ha-shabbat hashvi'im* (the seventh Shabbat)." This is what really got me because what it is saying is *"until the day after the seventh Shabbat"*!! There's no ambiguity to that. It's got to be on the day after a weekly Shabbat, not seven weeks later on a Wednesday. It finishes by saying, *tispru khamishim yom* (count fifty days) and bring a new grain offering to Adonai."

So again, verse 16 leaves no doubt. *"ohd mih-mah-khar-raht* (until the day after) *ha-shabbat hashvi'im* (the seventh Shabbat)." There's no other way you should translate that.

I hope you can see as I did how clear it is in the Hebrew. And also that the fiftieth day must also be a "day after the Shabbat." The day that you start the count is the day that you do the wave offering which is on the day after Shabbat and then 50 days later, Shavuot is supposed to be on the day after the seventh Shabbat.

The Tree of Life Version (TLV), that we use for the Tanakh Scriptures in this book, is as close to the Hebrew as you can get while keeping correct English grammar and syntax.

Leviticus 23:15-16 (TLV) Then you are to count from the morrow after the Shabbat, from the day that you brought the omer of the wave offering, seven complete Shabbatot. 16 Until the morrow after the seventh Shabbat you are to count fifty days, and then present a new grain offering to ADONAI.

The New Kings James Version (NKJV) also is very accurate.

Leviticus 23:15-16 (NKJV) And you shall count for yourselves from the day after the Sabbath, from the day that you brought the sheaf of the wave offering: seven Sabbaths shall be completed. 16 Count fifty days to the day after the seventh Sabbath; then you shall offer a new grain offering to the LORD.

But what about other translations? I took a look at two Jewish translations. The first one is the Complete Jewish Bible. You need to understand that the Tanakh section of it is not

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a translation from the original by David Stern. He just took an existing, out-of-copyright, Jewish translation and updated the pronunciations of the names and some out-dated English words in it. (It is only the New Covenant that he translated from the original.) So both of the following are the standard Jewish Publication Society (JPS) translation from 1917. They are a little different because of David Stern's updating from the JPS English, etc.

Leviticus 23:16 (CJB) until the day after the seventh week; you are to count fifty days; and then you are to present a new grain offering to ADONAI.

Leviticus 23:16 (JPS 1917) even unto the morrow after the seventh week shall ye number fifty days; and ye shall present a new meal-offering unto the LORD.

Notice the switch from "the day after the Shabbat" to "the day after the seventh week." It doesn't say "week" "shavuah" there at all. It says "Shabbat." (In Hebrew, there's a big enough difference between "Shabbat" $\Box \Box \Box$ and "shavuah" and "shavuah" $\Box \Box \Box \Box$. Only the first two Hebrew letters are the same.) And yet they've changed it to "week." So you can see, there's something up here.

Keeping the Two Separate

There sure seems to be an intentional switching—an intentional making of the translation such that it supports the Jewish community's position that it should be the day after Passover that you begin the Omer count.

As noted above, the NKJV and the TLV translate it very accurately from the Hebrew.

Leviticus 23:16 (NKJV) Count fifty days to the day after the seventh Sabbath.....

Leviticus 23:16 (TLV) Until the morrow after the seventh Shabbat...

The Torah clearly makes the days of Firstfruits and Shavuot both Sundays. To me the Hebrew couldn't be any more clear than that. So, if we follow the Hebrew, which we in the Messianic Movement do, it would be very clear that the day that the count starts would be on Sunday, and thus Shavuot would always be on a Sunday.

Why the difference? Why this seemingly intentional change? If Judaism interpreted the verses as written in the Hebrew, Firstfruits would always fall on the Sunday during Unleavened Bread, which would be on Resurrection Day, on a Sunday like the Christians celebrate! And Shavuot would always fall on a Sunday seven weeks later, which would be on the Christian holiday of Pentecost!

So the mis-translations, I believe, are clearly done to keep the Jewish and Christian holidays from being connected in the minds of the Jewish people. This was done by the Jewish translators. It's clear to me that they didn't want the Jewish people to see that Yeshua was fulfilling Jewish Biblical holidays. It's interesting how far they went from what it actually says in the Hebrew, so they wouldn't have to have the embarrassment, if you will, of having to keep explaining when their people ask questions like, "Well, how come the Christians are celebrating a holiday the same day we're celebrating a holiday?" This way most years the two do not line up.

This also worked to keep Christian scholars from seeing that Christianity is really Jewish because they also wouldn't see that the holidays line up. They would just take the Jewish people's word for it. "Oh, we celebrate on a different day." But I think that in the beginning in Acts, they were both on the exact same day, and what is at work here are anti-Semitism and anti-Christ spirits. Anti-Christ spirits are keeping the Jewish people from seeing Yeshua, and anti-Semitic spirits are keeping the Christians from seeing their connection to the Jewish people and their Jewish roots. It is really sad.


